

Albertans' Views on Climate and Energy

Conducted between April 27 and May 4, 2026

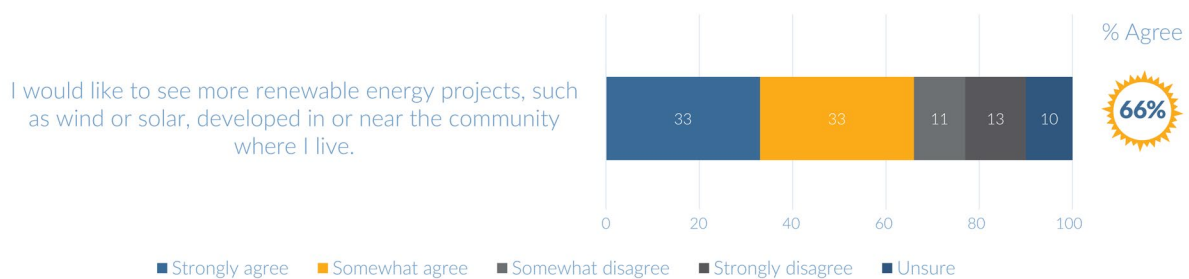

Methodology

Survey questions were administered through Probe Research between April 27 and May 4, 2026. Probe Research conducted an online survey with a representative sample of 1,484 Alberta adults between April 27 and May 6, 2026. This included an oversample of 598 Calgary adults. Because an online survey is a sample of convenience, no margin of error can be ascribed. For the purposes of comparison, a probabilistic sample of 1,484 would have a margin of error of ± 2.5 percentage points, 19 times out of 20. The margin of error would be higher within each of the survey's population sub-groups.

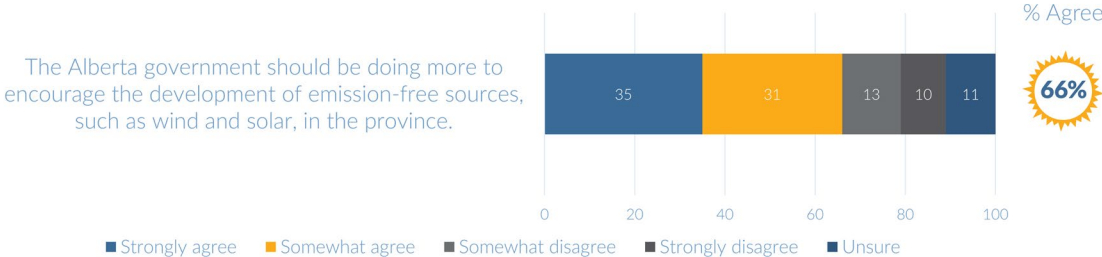
